The year has been busy transitioning with new board members, planning and holding our major fundraiser and 20th anniversary celebration "Run the Race" last April. I am grateful for the leadership, time and dedication of our board members, the committee chairwomen, and the fundraising committee. Although our leadership team is small in numbers, the effort and collaboration have been huge as we met our fund-raising goals for 2024. CCSA continues to seek new members and attract young professional members with today's high-tech skills of web design, online marketing, sales, and social media expertise.



In 2024 CCSA was still rebounding from the impact of Covid. We are thankful that one of our favorite outreach groups, Grady Rockers, is slowly being revitalized as members are able to meet the new updated guidelines established by Grady Hospital and have begun "rocking babies" once again in the NICU.
