A Note from our Co-Presidents

"Take my hands and let them work for You; take my mind, my memory, my will and make me use them all to do Your will on earth" ~Mary Virginia Merrick

These words from our founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, served as inspiration this past year as we fully emerged from two years of marked changes in our world and neighborhoods. CCSA learned to adapt and pivot in order

to meet the needs of those we serve. Some of the relationships with our Outreach partners have changed, where and how we serve looks different yet the opportunities to serve children in need of resources have grown. For almost 20 years, our Atlanta chapter has taken up the cause of improving childhood literacy as a means of carrying out our mission of increasing skills and self esteem, and promoting resiliency and self sufficiency in the children we serve.

This cause is imperative now more than ever in light of the recent pandemic. Studies have shown the degree to which schools and learning were disrupted over the last two years was so profound that the effects may damage the prospects of an entire generation of young people. To that end, our "All in for Literacy" letter campaign, headed by Hendie Salton and Patti Anhut, focused on raising funds to support the literacy efforts of our chapter. It was a resounding success, allowing us to fully fund the teachers, staff and material support for our Summer Enrichment Programs at St. Peter Claver and Our Lady of Victory Schools. The data from these programs show an overall improvement in the student's test scores as well as being a source of fun and enjoyment!

We were provided the opportunity this summer, to serve two new outreaches: Latino Association for Parents of Public Schools/LAPPS and MUST Ministries. We provided new books to children participating in LAPPS Summer Event Series in five metropolitan Atlanta areas and our volunteers provided supplies and packed nearly 200 lunches for MUST to distribute to children missing out on school sponsored lunch programs during the summer months.

We were honored to receive generous donations not only from our fundraising efforts, but from local parishes, church groups and even an anonymous donor to support our efforts. We strive to be good stewards of these gifts and were pleased to initiate the Mary Virginia Merrick scholarship for students applying to high school and a literacy grant to support the library and reading resource programs at St. Peter Claver Regional Catholic School.

We continue to provide assistance to mothers and babies in need with our Layette Program. Although still unable to return to in-person rocking, our Grady Rockers have assembled over 100 mini-layettes, which include a board book and a coloring book for NICU graduates. This year we delivered over 132 full layettes to our outreach partners, including the mobile unit of The Hope Center as a new recipient. Our Garden at The Elaine Clark Center is thriving and its bounty was used by the Center's chef in crafting meals for the children. We are thrilled to be back in person, sponsoring Fall on the Farm day with a petting zoo, books and crafts at the Child Development Academy.

We are so grateful to our community partners who collected books, sponsored diaper and formula drives and days of service for CCSA. Every Christ Child Society member can celebrate these accomplishments as they are the reason we are able to reach so many in the greater Atlanta area. We truly could not be the "working hands" Mary Virginia Merrick speaks of without the unfailing support of our members and the tireless efforts of our Board!

Thank you for your support and let's continue to improve children's lives together.

Classroom, Library & Staff Support at St. Peter Claver Regional Catholic School and our Summer Enrichment Program at St. Peter Claver and Our Lady of Victiory.




As part of our *Let's Learn!* Program, CCSA members volunteer at St. Peter Claver Regional Catholic School (SPC) on Tuesdays and Fridays to help in various ways. Our SPC Outreach Coordinator, **Dodie Snider**, works closely with the school and looks for opportunities where we can support literacy in the school's underserved population where many students are learning English as a second language.

Christ Child Society of Atlanta has had the pleasure of working with Kathy Schenck in the library for the past several years. This year there is a new media specialist, Sharon Gex Davis, at SPC. She brings excitement and new energy to the library and we look forward to supporting her! In the media center, volunteers read to the students, assist with crafts, shelve books, create bulletin boards, and various other projects. They offer support to the classroom teachers and staff in any way they can. We are looking forward to resuming the one-on-one tutoring that is so important to these students.

Susanne Greenwood, the principal of SPC is always supportive and appreciative of CCSA's help. Due to the generosity of our members and donors, this year CCSA was able to support literacy at higher levels by providing a grant for reading support and tutorial services for the students as well as our yearly purchase of new wish list books for the library. Seventy books, including Caldecott, Coretta Scott King, and Newberry Award Winners were added to the school's library. Our annual Christmas Party was back in person, for its 6th year, with a Pizza Party and gift of a new book for each student. At the end of the school year, CCSA hosted the Accelerated Reader (AR) Ice Cream Social, where the students played a round of miniature golf on a course created from cardboard boxes, Legos and other items. The students, staff and our volunteers had so much fun! and our members recognize the importance of reaching out to these young learners and instilling the love of books & reading. We are always looking for new volunteers to join us in this vital and rewarding outreach!







CCSA is most proud to support one of our biggest programs: Summer Enrichment at **Our Lady of Victory** and **St. Peter Claver Regional Catholic School** for students ranging from Pre-K through 7th grade. Both schools held programs over an eight-day period in June focused on reading and math skills. The students also enjoyed Art, Music, Outdoor Sports, Media and Digital Enrichment, and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) activities. These extra curricular classes helped to mold the whole child and provide smiles and giggles all around!

Lisa Shupenus, OLV program coordinator, shared her feedback: "I think with the pandemic, these kids needed time to come back, be relaxed, and spend quality time together with their teachers and friends. At the end of the day they didn't want to go home. Thank you for supporting us and giving our school this blessing!"

Breanna Johnson-Anderson served as cocoordinator for the SPC program. She shared her thoughts: "We had a great end to our twoweek summer enrichment camp! I saw growth in all students who attended our camp and their smiles confirmed it every day! Thank you again for everything! Please pass along our gratitude to all the CCSA members."

In both programs, significant gains were reported in reading and math. Many students showed a 10 to 20 percent gain in skills, with some students realizing even greater gains from the small group and one-on-one instruction.

Christ Child Society of Atlanta funded teacher salaries for the two camp sessions and provided snacks for the students. A collection of used books was also donated to each camp session. Every student was able to take home a minimum of two new books. Students took so much pride in choosing new books that were going to be a part of their home library.

This is an important need in our outreach community and we are so grateful to all of our members and community partners for supporting our fundraising efforts which allow us to serve these deserving children.

We could not have achieved

this without our tireless fundraising committee, along with the design, technical and financial teams for whom we are so grateful!

Outreach update



MUST MINISTRIES

Since 1995, MUST Ministries has been partnering with churches, schools, corporations and volunteers to feed children in the metro-Atlanta area in the summer. These children miss schoolsponsored lunch programs during the summer months and often go hungry. CCSA was thrilled to assist MUST Ministries in this very vital program for we know that "a hungry child cannot learn". This past June and July, CCSA purchased supplies for breakfast/lunch kits and acquired several gently used books. Our volunteers gathered at the homes of Casey Long, Gina Steers, Barbara Miller and Sally McNulty to assemble nearly 200 meal kits which, along with the books, were delivered to and distributed by MUST. We look forward to continuing our partnership next summer.

LatinoAssociation for Parents of Public Schools/ LAPPS

This past summer, CCSA received a request from a woman who knew us from our bookshelf at Good Samaritan. Azucena is an Equity Angel with Latino Association of Parents of Public Schools, whose mission is to empower parents to be fundamental and active participants in their childrens' education. During the summer months, LAPPS sponsored science and reading lessons at "pop-ups" in five Latino neighborhoods in metro-Atlanta. In creating a partnership with LAPPS, CCSA supplied and delivered 220 new books from their wishlist as well as 200 donated books for the children to take home. Casey Long, Susan Reinhard and Maureen Conboy visited two of the popups and met with the children and staff. We are so pleased to work with LAPPS in providing reading materials for students for whom English is a second language. Studies have shown this population was made more vulnerable to decreased literacy rates in light of the pandemic and school closures. Placing books in the homes of these children is vital to developing an interest and love of reading. CCSA looks forward to continuing this partnership!
